

SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT

WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY 2/17/20 – 2/23/20



(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)

The past week the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **256** calls for service.

WEAPONS VIOLATION

On February 22ND, an officer initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle with expired registration, near College Avenue and Holly Lane. The driver, a 20-year-old South Milwaukee woman, had a suspended driving status and was found to be in possession of brass knuckles. She was arrested and issued citations for Operating after Suspension, Operating a Motor Vehicle Without Insurance, and Carrying a Concealed Weapon.

WARRANT ARREST

On February 21st, a citizen reported an unknown individual knocked on the back door of a residence in the 1700 Block of Milwaukee Avenue before leaving in a vehicle. Officers located the vehicle, which had a suspended registration, and a traffic stop was initiated. After first providing false identification, the driver was identified as a 31-year-old Milwaukee man who was found to have several felony warrants with the Jackson County Sheriff's Office. The man also showed signs of impairment and admitted to consuming illegal drugs. He was arrested and taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility on the warrants. He was also referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on a charge of Operating While Intoxicated-Second Offense.

On February 23rd, an officer on patrol received an alert the owner of a vehicle observed in the 2900 Block of South Chicago Avenue had a confirmed warrant with the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office. The officer spoke with a 37-year-old Milwaukee man that was driving the vehicle and he was found to have a valid warrant. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was turned over to deputies from the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

On February 23rd, officers were dispatched to a report of two subjects arguing in the 1100 Block of Milwaukee Avenue. Officers spoke with two 29-year-old South Milwaukee men who were involved in an altercation and were intoxicated. One of the men continued to act in a loud and profane manner despite being warned to calm down. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

RETAIL THEFT

On February 21st, officers were dispatched to a report of a man leaving a business in the 1100 Block of Marquette Avenue without paying for items. The man pushed past store employees and fled in a vehicle. Officers from the Cudahy Police Department located the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop on Interstate 794 in Cudahy. South Milwaukee officers responded to the stop where Cudahy officers had two individuals detained, and the missing items from the store were located in the vehicle. A 38-year-old Milwaukee man was identified as the man who took the items and he was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued a citation for Retail Theft. The other individual, identified as a 37-year-old Milwaukee man, was found to have a confirmed warrant with the Franklin Police Department. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he signed a Personal Recognizance Bond on the warrant.
