

SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT

WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY 4/19/21 – 5/5/21



(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)

The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **412** calls for service.

HIT AND RUN ACCIDENT

On April 19TH, a resident in the 1700 Block of Forest Hill Avenue reported a mailbox having been struck by an unknown vehicle the night before. Officers responding to the scene located the damage mailbox along with vehicle parts and damage to the lawn of the residence. Following an investigation, officers were able to identify the driver of the striking vehicle as a 31-year-old Milwaukee man. The man admitted to striking the mailbox and he was issued a citation for Hit and Run.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

On April 29th, officers were dispatched to a business in the 2300 Block of 10th Avenue for a report of an unruly customer. Upon arrival officers observed shelves were pulled down and merchandise was scattered about the store. The customer, a 51-year-old South Milwaukee man, was intoxicated and admitted to knocking over the shelves. He was arrested and issued citations for Disorderly Conduct and Damage to Property.

On April 28th, officers were dispatched to the 1600 Block of Marion Avenue for a report of a woman being dragged by a vehicle following an argument. Officers spoke with a 36-year-old South Milwaukee woman who stated she was arguing with a 23-year-old Cudahy man and was briefly dragged when the Cudahy man drove away from the scene. South Milwaukee Fire Department personnel responded and transported the woman to a hospital for observation. Officers located the Cudahy man and his vehicle nearby and he was arrested and referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on a charge of Recklessly Endangering Safety.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On April 27th, officers were dispatched to a business in the 1100 Block of Montana Avenue for a report of an intoxicated individual attempting to drive away from the area. Officers spoke with a 47-year-old South Milwaukee man who was attempting to pick up his vehicle and admitted to driving the vehicle a short distance before being stopped by a closed gate. The man showed signs of impairment and he was arrested. The man was referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office where he was charged with Operating While Intoxicated-8th Offense and Operating After Revocation.

On April 30th, an officer on patrol observed a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed in the 1100 Block of Milwaukee Avenue and a traffic stop was initiated near 12th and Milwaukee Avenues. The driver, a 45-year-old South Milwaukee man, showed signs of impairment. The man was arrested and issued citations for Unreasonable and Imprudent Speed and Operating Without Insurance. He was referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office where he was charged with Operating While Intoxicated-4th Offense.

DRUG INVESTIGATION

On April 26th, officers were dispatched to the 2300 Block of 10th Avenue for a report of a subject inside a parked vehicle possibly using illegal narcotics. Upon arrival, an officer observed a female later identified as a 32-year-old South Milwaukee woman, consuming illegal narcotics while inside the vehicle. The woman was arrested and drug paraphernalia was located inside the vehicle. The woman was issued citations for Marijuana Possession and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. She was referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on a charge of Possession of Fentanyl.

THEFT

On April 26th, officers were dispatched to business in the 1000 Block of Milwaukee Avenue after an employee reviewing surveillance video observed an individual take items out of a package that was left as a donation. Officers identified the individual as a 28-year-old South Milwaukee woman who admitted to taking the items. The items were returned and the woman was issued a citation for Theft.
