

SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT

WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY *10/4/21 – 10/17/21*

(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)



The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **442** calls for service.

BATTERY

On October 13th, officers were dispatched to the 1400 Block of Missouri Avenue for a report of an unwanted individual. Officers spoke with a 24-year-old Oak Creek woman and a 20-year-old South Milwaukee man who stated an unknown subject who did not live at the residence grabbed the woman by her shirt collar and attempted to choke her. The subject, identified as a 55-year-old South Milwaukee man, was intoxicated and believed he was at his own residence when he was not. He was arrested and taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility and was later charged by the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office with misdemeanor Battery and Disorderly Conduct.

On October 10th, officers were dispatched to a report of individuals fighting in the 900 Block of Milwaukee Avenue. Officers spoke with several people including a 56-year-old South Milwaukee man who had injuries from the altercation. Several witnesses stated a 33-year-old South Milwaukee man struck the injured man with a drinking glass. Witnesses also stated a 31-year-old South Milwaukee man struck members of the victim's family. South Milwaukee Fire Department personnel responded and transported the victim to the hospital for his injuries. The 33-year-old South Milwaukee man was arrested and taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility and referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on a charge of Substantial Battery. The 31-year-old South Milwaukee man was issued citations for Battery and Disorderly Conduct.

On October 16th, a 35-year-old South Milwaukee woman came to the police department to report being battered by a 37-year-old South Milwaukee man in the 1600 Block of Manistique Avenue. South Milwaukee Fire Department personnel responded and transported the woman to the hospital for treatment of injuries. Officers arrested the man and he was taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility. The Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office charged the man with Strangulation and Suffocation-Use of a Dangerous Weapon, Battery, Disorderly Conduct, and Knowingly Violating a Domestic Abuse Injunction. All charges also carried a Habitual Criminality Repeater.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

On October 8th, officers were dispatched to a reported road rage incident near College and Nicholson Avenues. Officers spoke with a 31-year-old Milwaukee woman who reported getting into an altercation with another motorist she claimed was tailgating her. During the altercation the other motorist reached into her vehicle and knocked her sunglasses off before leaving the area. The other motorist was identified as a 40-year-old Cudahy man and officers spoke with him at his residence. He admitted to reaching into the vehicle after becoming upset at the woman for suddenly stopping and apologized for his actions. He was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

On October 8th, officers were dispatched to a business in the 3100 Block of South Chicago Avenue for a report of individuals arguing and one of the individuals possibly being armed with a knife. Officers spoke with a 31-year-old Cudahy man who stated he argued with a 34-year-old Racine man after the Racine man attempted to cut in the drive-thru line. The Racine man admitted to exiting his vehicle to initiate the argument and a small pocket knife was located in his vehicle. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

RETAIL THEFT

On October 6th, officers were dispatched to a business in the 200 Block of North Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual in the store who had been previously banned due to numerous thefts. Officers spoke with a 28-year-old Cudahy man who acknowledged he was not allowed in the store. The man was in possession of items from the store that had not been paid for. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued citations for Retail Theft and Trespassing.
