

# ***SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT***

## ***WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY 5/16/22 – 5/29/22***



(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)

The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **426** calls for service.

### **BATTERY**

On May 17<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the area of 10<sup>th</sup> and Minnesota Avenues for a report of person being struck by another individual while aboard a Milwaukee County Transit bus. Officers spoke with a 70-year-old South Milwaukee woman who stated she was struck by another female while on the bus following an argument. The other individual was located nearby and was identified as a 27-year-old Milwaukee woman. Surveillance video showed both women as equal participants in the argument before the Milwaukee woman struck the South Milwaukee woman. The Milwaukee woman was arrested and issued a citation for Battery and the South Milwaukee woman was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

### **DISORDERLY CONDUCT**

On May 20<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 900 Block of Milwaukee Avenue for a report of an individual creating a disturbance and arguing with people. Officers spoke with a man who admitted to arguing with a 21-year-old South Milwaukee man. The man originally provided false identification information. He was eventually identified as a 52-year-old South Milwaukee man and was found to have two confirmed South Milwaukee warrants. The man was arrested and a crack pipe was located in his pocket. He was taken to the police station where he was issued citations for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Obstructing. He signed a personal recognizance bond on the warrants.

**On May 23<sup>rd</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 1100 Block of Milwaukee Avenue for a report of a subject attempting to enter parked vehicles by pounding on windows and trying door handles. A second caller reported the same subject attempted to enter a residence in the area. Officers located a 25-year-old West Allis man nearby who matched the description given. The man admitted to trying door handles and was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct. No vehicles sustained damage and none appeared to have been entered.**

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

**On May 29<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 1800 Block of Elm Avenue for a report of a vehicle parked running with occupants who appeared to be passed out. Officers were able to wake both occupants and the driver, a 32-year-old Milwaukee man, showed signs of impairment. The passenger, a 36-year-old Milwaukee man, was found to have a confirmed Felony Probation and Parole warrant for Armed Robbery. The driver also was found to have a Probation hold for Carrying a Concealed Weapon and Felon in Possession of a Firearm. Marijuana and open beer bottles were located in the vehicle. Both the driver and the passenger were arrested and taken to the police station where the driver was issued citations for Operating While Intoxicated-First Offense, Open Intoxicants in a Vehicle, and Possession of Marijuana. Both the driver and passenger were transported to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility on the Probation holds and warrants.**

### **RETAIL THEFT**

**On May 29<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 200 Block of North Chicago Avenue for report of an individual leaving a business without paying for items. Officers located a 58-year-old Cudahy man who matched the description given. The man was located urinating alongside a nearby building and he was arrested. He was also found to be in possession of the items taken from the store. He was taken to the police station where he was issued citations for Retail Theft and Disorderly Conduct before being released.**
