

# ***SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT***

## ***WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY 10/31/22 – 11/13/22***



(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)

The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **454** calls for service.

### **CRIMINAL DAMAGE**

On November 8<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 1100 Block of Marquette Avenue for a report of an individual damaging vehicles. Officers located numerous vehicles with damage to the outside mirrors and the front window of a business to have been broken. Officers spoke with a 39-year-old South Milwaukee woman who matched the description given and she admitted to causing the damage. The woman became uncooperative and was arrested. She was taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility and referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on charges of Criminal Damage to Property, Resisting Arrest, and Disorderly Conduct.

### **HIT AND RUN ACCIDENT**

On November 12<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to North Chicago and Davis Avenues for a report of a hit and run accident. Officers spoke with a 34-year-old South Milwaukee woman who stated her vehicle was struck from behind causing significant damage. The woman reported the striking vehicle reversed and left the scene. She was able to provide the license plate number of the striking vehicle and the vehicle owner advised a 32-year-old Oak Creek man was the driver. Officers located the vehicle and the Oak Creek man in the city of Cudahy and he admitted to being involved in the accident. He was arrested and issued citations for Hit and Run, Failure to Notify Police of an Accident, and Failure to Keep Vehicle Under Control.

## **WEAPONS VIOLATION**

On November 4<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to 13<sup>th</sup> and Marshall Avenues for a report of gunshots being heard. Officers searched the area and were unable to locate anyone. On November 5<sup>th</sup>, a 19-year-old Milwaukee man came to the police station to report his vehicle was shot at while he was parked near 13<sup>th</sup> and Marshall Avenues the night before. Further investigation revealed the 19-year-old and another 19-year-old Milwaukee man went to a residence in the 2500 Block of 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue to settle a debt with two 21-year-old South Milwaukee men. When the 19-year-olds attempted to complete the transaction with counterfeit money, an argument ensued and a weapon was discharged. Charges of Recklessly Endangering Safety and Recklessly Endangering Safety Party to a Crime have been referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on the 21-year-old men. The 19-year-old Milwaukee men have been referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on charges of Disorderly Conduct and Obstructing. The investigation is ongoing.

## **DISORDERLY CONDUCT**

On November 13<sup>th</sup> officers were dispatched to the 3800 Block of 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue for a report of an individual urinating by a parked vehicle. Officers located a 30-year-old Cudahy man near a parked vehicle and a large wet spot on the roadway. The man admitted to urinating by the vehicle and he was arrested. He was taken to the police station and issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

## **WARRANT ARREST**

On November 10, an officer on patrol initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle traveling over the speed limit near Nicholson and Elm Avenues. The driver, a 34-year-old Milwaukee man, had a revoked driving status along with traffic warrants from Racine and Kenosha Counties. Marijuana was also located in the vehicle. The man was arrested and issued citations for Operating After Revocation, Exceeding Posted Speed Zones (30-34 mph), and Possession of Marijuana. He was turned over to deputies from the Kenosha County Sheriff's Office on their warrant.
