

# ***SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT***

## ***WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY 1/9/23 – 1/22/23***



(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)

The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **403** calls for service.

### **DISORDERLY CONDUCT**

On January 12<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 1300 Block of Milwaukee Avenue for a report of an individual displaying a weapon. Witnesses identified a 62-year-old South Milwaukee man as the individual and stated he was waving a firearm in the air. The man was intoxicated and a BB gun was located nearby. The BB gun was collected and the man was arrested and taken to the police department where he was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

On January 19<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 1700 Block of Missouri Avenue for a report of an intoxicated individual that would not leave a residence. Officers spoke to a 63-year-old South Milwaukee woman who stated a 46-year-old South Milwaukee man was no longer welcome at the residence after causing problems. The man was intoxicated and found to be on probation with absolute sobriety as a condition of his bail. The man was also found to be in possession of liquor. An Order to Detain was issued by Probation and Parole and the man was arrested. He was taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility on the Probation Order.

On January 13<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 1100 Block of Milwaukee Avenue for a report of an individual refusing to leave a business. Officers spoke with a 31-year-old South Milwaukee man who briefly left but returned a short time later. The man became uncooperative and refused to leave the business. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued citations for Trespassing and Resisting/Obstructing.

## **BATTERY**

On January 13<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 1900 Block of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue for a report of an altercation between two individuals. Officers spoke with a 51-year-old South Milwaukee woman who stated a 70-year-old South Milwaukee man grabbed her neck and struck her after being asked to turn music down. Officers spoke with the man who admitted to being involved in the altercation. He was arrested and taken to the police station. He was taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility and referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on charges of Battery and Disorderly Conduct.

## **RETAIL THEFT**

On December 25<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to a business in the 2900 Block of South Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual taking alcohol bottles from the store without paying for them. Officers located a 58-year-old Milwaukee man near 13<sup>th</sup> and Mackinac Avenues that matched the description given. The alcohol bottles from the store were located inside the man's backpack and drug paraphernalia was located in his pocket. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued citations for Retail Theft and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

On January 11<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to a business in the 2900 Block of South Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual leaving the store without paying for items. Witnesses stated the individual boarded a Milwaukee County Transit bus after leaving the store. Officers located a 32-year-old Milwaukee man that matched the description given on a bus parked at 15<sup>th</sup> and Marquette Avenues. The man had a backpack and the unpaid for store items were located inside. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued a citation for Retail Theft.
