

# ***SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT***

## ***WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY 5/1/23 – 5/14/23***



(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)

The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **524** calls for service.

### **DISORDERLY CONDUCT**

On May 11<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 200 Block of North Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual yelling profanities and threatening pedestrians. Officers spoke with a 60-year-old Milwaukee man who continued to be loud and profane with officers. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

On May 8<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 2900 Block of South Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual who returned to the property after being advised earlier he was not welcome there. Officers spoke with a 22-year-old Delavan man who had been advised numerous times prior he was not allowed on the property. The man became argumentative and began to yell loudly. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued citations for Disorderly Conduct and Resisting/Obstructing. He was released to a family member.

On May 2<sup>nd</sup>, officers were dispatched to a business in the 2900 Block of South Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual previously banned from the business returning. Officers spoke with a 38-year-old Milwaukee man who admitted he knew he was banned from the business. He was arrested and pills were located in his pocket during a search incident to arrest. The pills tested positive for methamphetamines. The man was also out on bail for a felony case of Threat to an Employee of a Health Care Facility. He was issued a citation for Trespassing and taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility. He was referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on charges of Possession of Methamphetamines and Felony Bail Jumping.

On May 3<sup>rd</sup>, officers were dispatched to a business in the 1800 Block of 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue for a report of individuals threatening patrons. Officers spoke with witnesses who stated a male and female became involved in an argument with patrons and threatened them before leaving. The witnesses were able to provide a license plate number of the vehicle the two individuals left in. Officers made contact with the vehicle owner, a 45-year-old Cudahy woman, who admitted to being in the business and being in an argument. She would not identify the male individual who was with her. She was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

On May 12<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to a report of a vehicle driving erratically in the 800 Block of Hawthorne Avenue. Officers located a running vehicle parked across the sidewalk and driveway with a driver who was unresponsive. The driver, a 26-year-old South Milwaukee man, woke up after Narcan was administered. South Milwaukee Fire Department personnel responded to evaluate the man. The man admitted to consuming prescription medication prior to driving. He was arrested and issued citations for Operating While Impaired-First Offense and Operating With a Restricted Controlled Substance-First Offense. He was released to a sober, responsible adult.

### **TRAFFIC OFFENSE**

On May 13<sup>th</sup>, an officer monitoring traffic near Beech Street and Nicholson Avenue observed a vehicle traveling above the posted speed limit. When the officer attempted to initiate a traffic stop, the vehicle drove erratically in an attempt to elude the officer before eventually stopping on Robert Avenue in the city of Cudahy. The driver, a 17-year-old Milwaukee boy, admitted to not stopping for the officer. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued citations for Speeding and Operating a Motor Vehicle by Permittee Without a Parent. He was referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office Community Prosecutor on a charge of Fleeing/Eluding an Officer. He was released to his mother. A 17-year-old Milwaukee girl who was a passenger in the vehicle was taken to the police station and turned over to her father.
