

SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT

WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY 6/12/23 – 6/25/23



(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)

The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **517** calls for service.

HIT AND RUN ACCIDENT

On June 24th, 38-year-old South Milwaukee man reported his vehicle was struck while it was parked in the 1800 Block of Rawson Avenue. Vehicle parts that were left behind indicated the striking vehicle was a black Tesla. After a message was put out to area departments, an officer with the Oak Creek Police Department advised he had arrested a 36-year-old Milwaukee woman on June 24th who was operating a black Tesla with damage and paint transfer that matched the struck vehicle. Officers observed the Tesla in a tow lot and the collected parts left behind at the scene matched the damage on the Tesla. The Milwaukee woman was issued a citation for Hit and Run.

STOLEN VEHICLE RECOVERY

On June 20th, officers assisted the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office with the recovery of a stolen vehicle at the Grant Park Main Beach. Information was relayed that two occupants of the stolen vehicle left the scene in another vehicle. Officers with the Cudahy Police Department located that vehicle near College Avenue and Lake Drive. Officers assisted Cudahy officers in conducting a traffic stop in the 2400 Block of East College Avenue. All occupants of the vehicle were taken into custody and turned over to deputies from the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office.

BATTERY

On June 17th, officers were dispatched to the 1100 Block of Milwaukee Avenue for a report of a male battering a female. Officers spoke with a 26-year-old Racine man and a 26-year-old Racine woman who were both intoxicated and denied an altercation occurred. Officers observed surveillance video from a nearby establishment that showed the man strike the woman. The man was arrested and taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility before being referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on a charge of Substantial Battery.

RETAIL THEFT

On June 19th, officers were dispatched to a report of an individual leaving a business in the 2900 Block of South Chicago Avenue without paying for liquor. Officers located a 40-year-old St. Francis man who matched the description given. The man was in possession of the missing liquor. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued a citation for Retail Theft.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On June 13th, officers were dispatched to the 1800 Block of Drexel Boulevard for a report of an intoxicated individual refusing to leave a residence. Officers spoke with a 46-year-old South Milwaukee woman who witnesses stated was being loud and disorderly. The woman admitted to pounding on the door of a residence. The woman's vehicle was located nearby parked against another vehicle. Both vehicles had damage indicating a minor crash had occurred. The woman's belongings along with liquor bottles were inside the vehicle and she showed signs of impairment. She was arrested and taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility and referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on charges of Disorderly Conduct and Operating While Intoxicated-Second Offense.
