

# ***SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT***

## ***WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY 8/7/23 – 8/20/23***



(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)

The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **522** calls for service.

### **DISORDERLY CONDUCT**

On August 12<sup>th</sup>, employees from a business in the 2700 Block of South Chicago Avenue and two businesses in the 3100 Block of South Chicago Avenue reported an individual yelling loudly and creating a disturbance in each of the businesses. Officers located a 57-year-old Milwaukee woman on the sidewalk in the 3100 Block of South Chicago Avenue who matched the description given. The woman admitted to being in the businesses and not leaving when asked to do so. She was arrested and taken to the police station where she was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

On August 17<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to a report of a disturbance at a residence in the 900 Block of Milwaukee Avenue. A 29-year-old South Milwaukee man reported he was struck and threatened by a 45-year-old South Milwaukee man who left the residence prior to the arrival of officers. Officers located the 45-year-old man in the 900 Block of Marquette Avenue and he admitted to being involved in the altercation. He was arrested and taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility before being referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on a charge of Disorderly Conduct-Domestic Violence Related.

On August 7<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 2400 Block of Nicholson Avenue for a report of an individual yelling in the parking lot and pounding on vehicles. Witnesses directed officers to a 44-year-old Milwaukee woman who was sitting inside a vehicle that did not belong to her. The woman was intoxicated and continued to yell while speaking with officers. She was arrested and taken to the police station where she was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct. She was given a ride home and released to a sober, responsible adult. There was no damage to the vehicles in the area.

### **BATTERY**

On August 11<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to a residence in the 900 Block of Madison Avenue for a report of individuals arguing. Officers spoke with a 40-year-old Oak Creek woman and a 30-year-old Milwaukee woman who were involved in the argument. During the argument, the Milwaukee woman struck the Oak Creek woman in the face with a glass porch light cover. The Milwaukee woman was arrested and taken to the police station where she was issued a citation for Battery.

### **WEAPONS VIOLATION**

On August 12<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to a residence in the 500 Block of 11<sup>th</sup> Avenue for a report of individuals arguing. A 60-year-old South Milwaukee woman reported that a 22-year-old South Milwaukee man pointed a gun at her and threatened her during the argument. Officers located a firearm in the residence and arrested the man who admitted to threatening the woman with the firearm. He was taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility and referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on charges of Endangering Safety by Use of a Dangerous Weapon and Disorderly Conduct by Use of a Dangerous Weapon/Domestic Violence Related.

### **WARRANT ARREST**

On August 17<sup>th</sup>, an officer on patrol initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle whose registered owner returned a revoked driving status. The driver originally provided false identifying information before being identified as a 35-year-old Milwaukee woman. She was found to have four confirmed warrants with the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office. She was arrested and issued a citation for Operating After Revocation and Obstructing. She was turned over to deputies from the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office on the warrants.
