

# ***SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT***

## ***WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY 8/21/23 – 9/3/23***



(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)

The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **527** calls for service.

### **DISORDERLY CONDUCT**

On August 30<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 400 Block of Southtowne Drive for a report of two individuals arguing. Officers spoke with a 21-year-old South Milwaukee man and a 21-year-old Milwaukee woman who were involved in the argument. The man was found to have a confirmed temporary restraining order preventing him from contacting the woman. He was also found to have a confirmed warrant with the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office for Knowingly Violating a Domestic Abuse Order. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was turned over to Milwaukee County Sheriff's deputies on the warrant. He was referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on a charge of Knowingly Violating a Temporary Restraining Order.

### **WEAPONS VIOLATION**

On August 29<sup>th</sup>, an officer on patrol observed a vehicle operating without headlights in the 900 Block of Milwaukee Avenue and a traffic stop was initiated in the 800 Block of Milwaukee Avenue. The driver, a 38-year-old South Milwaukee man, was found to have two confirmed warrants with the Waukesha County Sheriff's Office and two warrants with the Winnebago County Sheriff's Office. He was arrested on the warrants and a firearm and marijuana were located during a search of the vehicle. The man was also found to have a felony conviction for Armed Robbery. The man was issued a citation for Possession of Marijuana and taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility on the warrants. He was referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office on a charge of Felon in Possession of a Firearm.

## **RETAIL THEFT**

**On August 23<sup>rd</sup>, officers were dispatched to a report of two individuals leaving a business in the 2900 Block of South Chicago Avenue without paying for items. An officer observed two individuals who matched the description given on a Milwaukee County Transit bus leaving the area. A traffic stop was initiated on the bus in the 2300 Block of 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue and officers spoke with a 49-year-old Milwaukee woman and a 58-year-old Milwaukee man. Both were in possession of the missing merchandise from the business and the man was found to have a confirmed felony warrant with Probation and Parole. Drug paraphernalia was also located on both the man and the woman. While officers were speaking with the two, the man ran away from officers. He was located under a vehicle in the 2300 Block of 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Both were arrested and taken to the police station. The woman was issued citations for Retail Theft and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. The man was issued citations for Retail Theft, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and Resisting Arrest. He was taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility on the warrant.**

**On August 26<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 200 Block of North Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual inside a business concealing items in an effort to not pay for them. Officers and store security spoke with a 44-year-old Milwaukee man and located several items of sports clothes from the store concealed in a bag. Drug paraphernalia was also located in his pocket. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued citations for Retail Theft and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.**

**On August 31<sup>st</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 200 Block of North Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual attempting to leave a business without paying for items. Officers spoke with a 59-year-old Milwaukee man who concealed liquor bottles in a backpack and attempted to leave without paying for them. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued a citation for Retail Theft.**
