

SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT

WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY *11/13/23 – 11/26/23*

(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)



The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **435** calls for service.

ATTEMPT HOMICIDE

On November 21st, officers were dispatched to the 300 Block of Southtowne Drive for a report of an individual with a cut to his throat following an altercation. Officers located a 23-year-old South Milwaukee man with serious injuries. South Milwaukee Fire Department personnel responded and transported the man to Froedtert Hospital. A 48-year-old Greendale man, who was an acquaintance of the South Milwaukee man, was taken into custody shortly thereafter by officers from the Franklin Police Department. He was taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility and charged by the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office with one count of Attempted First Degree Intentional Homicide, Use of a Dangerous Weapon.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

On November 25th, officers were dispatched to the 1600 Block of Minnesota Avenue for a report of individuals involved in a disturbance. Officers spoke with a 27-year-old South Milwaukee woman and a 25-year-old South Milwaukee woman who reported being involved in a physical altercation. A 52-year-old South Milwaukee man also became involved in the altercation and struck the 27-year-old woman. All three individuals were issued citations for Battery and Disorderly Conduct.

OPERATING AUTO WITHOUT OWNERS CONSENT

On November 14th, officers were dispatched to the 200 Block of North Chicago Avenue for a report of a disturbance. Officers spoke with a 19-year-old South Milwaukee woman who stated a 21-year-old Milwaukee man, who was an acquaintance, punched her and took her vehicle. The man was also found to have an open Milwaukee County felony case for Robbery with a condition of bail being no possession of weapons. The vehicle was located on November 15th in the 400 Block of Southtowne Place. Drug paraphernalia and a firearm were located in the vehicle. The Milwaukee man was charged by the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office with Operating a Vehicle Without Owner's Consent, Battery, and Felony Bail Jumping.

RETAIL THEFT

On November 16th, officers were dispatched to a business in the 200 Block of North Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual acting disorderly. Officers spoke with store security who had detained a 26-year-old Evanston, Illinois man. The man was observed using personal care products and putting them back on the shelf. The products could not be resold and were destroyed. The man was arrested and issued a citation for Retail Theft.

CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

On November 17th, officers were dispatched to a business in the 2900 Block of South Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual who broke a glass door with a fire extinguisher. Officers observed a broken door along with a damaged fire extinguisher and located a 33-year-old South Milwaukee man inside the store who was yelling and acting incoherent. South Milwaukee Fire Department personnel responded and transported the man to a hospital for treatment. The man was arrested and charged by the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office with Criminal Damage to Property, Felony Interference with Firefighting, and Disorderly Conduct.
