

# ***SOUTH MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT***

## ***WEEKLY CRIME SUMMARY 4/15/24 – 4/28/24***



(This report does not include every call for service but rather serves as a highlight of notable calls where a report was filed.)

The past two weeks the South Milwaukee Police Department responded to **484** calls for service.

### **DISORDERLY CONDUCT**

On April 22<sup>nd</sup>, officers were dispatched to a business in the 2900 Block of South Chicago Avenue for a report of an individual returning to the business after being asked to leave earlier. Officers located an intoxicated 48-year-old Milwaukee man lying on the sidewalk in front of the business. The man was previously warned not to return to the business. He was arrested and taken to the police station where he was issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct.

### **CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO PROPERTY**

On April 17<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 500 Block of Southtowne Drive for a report of an individual shouting and ringing doorbells of apartments. Officers spoke with a 30-year-old Milwaukee woman and a 25-year-old South Milwaukee man who were involved in an argument. During the argument the woman damaged the man's television and the man broke the woman's phone. The man also threw the woman's car keys on the roof of the apartment building. The South Milwaukee Fire Department responded to retrieve the woman's keys. Both were arrested and the woman was issued a citation for Criminal Damage to Property while the man was issued citations for Criminal Damage to Property and Disorderly Conduct.

**On April 21<sup>st</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 1100 Block of Carrington Avenue for a report of individuals spray painting graffiti on railroad cars parked on the tracks. Officers located a 14-year-old South Milwaukee boy in the area with a can of spray paint. He admitted to spray painting graffiti on the railroad cars. Officers also located a 14-year-old South Milwaukee girl and a 12-year-old South Milwaukee boy walking on the tracks. Both admitted to spray painting the railroad cars as well. All three juveniles were arrested and issued citations for Criminal Damage to Property and Trespassing. All three juveniles were released to their parents.**

## **THEFT**

**On April 21<sup>st</sup>, officers were dispatched to the 2900 Block of South Chicago Avenue after a caller reported having money and a speaker taken from his parked vehicle. The caller stated a 20-year-old Cudahy man and a 19-year-old South Milwaukee man were near the caller's vehicle when he parked it. Officers spoke with both who were in possession of the missing money and speaker. Each accused the other one of taking the money and speaker from the vehicle. Both were arrested and taken to the police station where they were issued citations for Theft.**

**On April 19<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to a business in the 3100 Block of South Chicago Avenue for a report of individuals leaving the business without paying for energy drinks and chips. Officers located a 30-year-old Cudahy man and a 41-year-old Racine woman walking in the area who matched the description given. Both were carrying shopping bags which they dropped when they saw officers approach. Inside the bags were the missing energy drinks and chips and both admitted to taking them without paying for them. Both were arrested and taken to the police station. A glass pipe commonly used with crack cocaine was located in the man's pocket. The man was issued citations for Retail Theft and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia while the woman was issued a citation for Retail Theft.**
