- Named Honorable Mention All-Southeast District
- Invited to the Wisconsin Baseball Coaches Association All-Star Classic
- Struck out 64 batters in 35.1 innings, while also hitting .397 with four home runs his senior year
- Was a First Team All-Conference infielder as a junior in 2021
- Ranked as the No. 3 recruit in all of Wisconsin by Perfect Game and the No. 2 right-handed pitcher


