PERMIT FEES (BASED ON DISTURBANCE AREA):

- Minor Land Disturbance (<1 acre): \$75 base fee, \$50 per inspection
- Major Land Disturbance (≥1 acre): \$100 base fee, \$75 per inspection
- Work Without a Permit: 3x the applicable fee

STANDARD REQUIREMENTS:

- Erosion control measures shall be installed **PRIOR** to ground disturbing activities, all in accordance with the approved erosion control plan on file with this permit.
- Erosion control measures shall be maintained and kept in place until adequate ground cover is established.
- Under this permit, the City will inspect the site erosion control measures periodically and as warranted after rainfall events. Permittee shall address remedial measures as noted in the City inspection report within 24 hours of notice. City erosion control inspections shall not relieve site owner/agent from their responsibilities for conducting their own inspections/keeping documentation as may be required by other agencies.
- All sediment tracked onto the roadway or otherwise having migrated off the site shall be cleaned up immediately by Permittee.

PERMIT CONDITIONS AND PROVISIONS

This permit is granted to allow performance of the specific work described below. The following standard provisions and included special provisions shall govern.

1. Owner or agent files application with Erosion Control Plan. Application includes the fee.
2. Staff reviews the application and Erosion Control Plan and advises the applicant of approval or modifications to plan.
3. Erosion Control measures are to be installed and maintained in accordance with WI DNR Technical Standards. You are required to provide proposed erosion control plan for review and approval by the City. City reserves the right to request changes to the proposed Erosion Control Plan.
4. The owner/agent installs erosion control measures and contacts the City for an initial inspection. (This initial inspection must be done prior to any land disturbing activity taking place.)
5. Once the initial inspection is preformed by the City and the erosion control measures are in compliance with the ordinances and the approved plan, an Erosion Control Permit will be issued.
6. Inspections shall be performed **ONCE A MONTH** and after ½" rainfall events or greater for the duration of the permit. Copies of your inspection report shall be made available to City Inspector upon request. The inspection report shall include the name of inspector, the location, date, and time of inspection, a description of the present phase of construction, the findings of the inspection, including an assessment of the condition of erosion and sediment control measures and the installation of storm water management BMPs, and any action needed or taken.
7. The City shall be granted access to conduct its own inspections once a month to confirm that the property is in compliance. Following the City's inspection, we will provide you with an Erosion Control Inspection Report to summarize our findings. All corrections/necessary repairs noted on report should be resolved within 24 hours.
8. Street/roadways in active construction site should be inspected once a day for tracking of sediment. If sediment is tracked onto the road, it must be cleaned by end of day. Higher traffic volume streets may require more frequent inspections and cleaned immediately.
9. The owner/agent shall be responsible for any damage to adjoining properties, municipal facilities or drainage ways caused by erosion, siltation, runoff, or equipment. The City may order immediate repairs or clean-up if determined that such damage was caused by activities under this permit. With approval of the adjacent landowner, the City may also order repairs or clean-up on other affected properties.
10. A minimum of 70% vegetative coverage or permanent methods must be in place prior to the removal of BMP's. Upon stabilization of the site and final inspection approval from the City, the owner/agent shall remove all temporary erosion control practices such as silt fence
